

MEPAU High School STEM Grant Program

for schools within 200km of Waitsia Gas Project

Terms and Conditions for Applicants

Submission of an application constitutes acceptance of these Mitsui E&P Australia Holdings Pty Ltd (MEPAU) High School STEM Grant terms and conditions.

1. Successful applicants (**Recipient**) will be required to sign and return a MEPAU 'Grant Agreement' prior to disbursement of grant funds. The Grant Agreement sets out the terms and conditions governing the grant and will replace these terms and conditions upon execution.
2. All schools considered for a MEPAU High School STEM Grant must have in place the appropriate insurances applicable for the event, program or initiative the grant money is requested for. This includes, but is not limited to, where applicable: Public Liability Insurance and Motor Vehicle Insurances. Recipients must provide certificates of currency upon request by MEPAU.
3. MEPAU may consider more applications than can be funded and as a result, the final decision regarding the successful applicant will be made by MEPAU in its sole and absolute discretion based on its assessment of individual grant applications against the assessment criteria. The final decision is to be made by MEPAU's External, Government & Stakeholder Relations Department (**EGSR**).
4. The decision of MEPAU is final and is not subject to any review. MEPAU may, but is not obliged to, provide the unsuccessful applicants with reasons as to why they were unsuccessful.
5. Unsuccessful applicants may apply for future grants which will be subject to the same assessment criteria and these terms and conditions.
6. The Recipient must use the grant for the purpose stated in the application and Grant Agreement. Unless prior written approval is obtained from MEPAU, any part of the grant monies that are not used must be repaid to MEPAU.
7. Recipients are required to complete the event, program, purchase or initiative within the time stipulated in the Grant Agreement which must be no later than twelve (12) months of receipt of funding.
8. No grant will be considered for past events, programs, purchases or initiatives.
9. On completion of the event, program, purchase or initiative, the Recipient must provide an acquittal and evaluation report, including an expenditure statement. Failure to provide the acquittal and evaluation report may jeopardise future funding opportunities.

10. As a condition of receiving a MEPAU grant, the Recipient must acknowledge MEPAU in all promotional material relating to the event, program, purchase or initiative. The Recipient will be provided with the MEPAU logo and associated guidelines to use in relation to this acknowledgment and must use the MEPAU logo in accordance with the terms of the Grant Agreement and guidelines provided.
11. All advertising, signage, media releases and other promotional material that contain the MEPAU logo or a reference to MEPAU must be submitted to and approved by MEPAU prior to its production and release. MEPAU also reserves the right to make amendments prior to any release.
12. As a condition of receiving a MEPAU grant, the Recipient must provide high-resolution photos and/or videos, and a written description of the event, program, purchase or initiative for MEPAU's use. All person(s) in supplied photos must sign a Photo Release Form and provide a copy of the completed form to MEPAU. A copy of the Photo Release Form is attached [Attachment 1]. The photos, description and completed Photo Release Form(s) must be supplied to MEPAU within 30 days of the event, program, purchase or initiative taking place.
13. MEPAU may use photos, videos and quotes from the Recipient for MEPAU's marketing purposes including advertising, publications and on the MEPAU website.
14. MEPAU may request the Recipient to take part in media activities organised by MEPAU.
15. The Recipient must not do anything that, in MEPAU's reasonable opinion, is or has the potential to cause harm to MEPAU or bring the brand or reputation of MEPAU into disrepute.
16. The Recipient must declare any affiliation or connection they may have with a Government organisation or Government official, MEPAU or any of its JV partners (including suppliers and contractors), or personal connection with any staff member of MEPAU or any of its JV partner organisations. Failure to disclose such affiliation(s) or connection(s) may result in the immediate termination of an application or Grant Agreement (as applicable). For the purposes of this paragraph, 'Government' means any government, or governmental, semi-governmental, administrative, fiscal or judicial body, department, responsible Minister, office, commission, delegate, authority, instrumentality, tribunal, board, agency, entity or organ of government, whether federal, state, territorial, or local, statutory or otherwise.
17. If the Recipient ceases carrying out the activities for which the grant was made or if MEPAU terminates the Grant Agreement on account of the Recipient's breach of the Grant Agreement, then the balance of the grant monies must be repaid to MEPAU.
18. Grant amounts are up to a maximum of \$1,000 per grant. The total grant payment provided by MEPAU includes an amount to cover any liability for GST, if applicable. If the supply of

anything under the Grant Agreement is a taxable supply under the GST Act, the Grant Funds shall be inclusive of GST.

19. If an applicant commits a breach of any of these terms and conditions, MEPAU can terminate the application at any time and without giving prior notice.
20. The MEPAU High School STEM Grant Program can be terminated by MEPAU in its sole and absolute discretion at any time without notice.
21. If a Recipient is provided with grant monies, this does not entitle them to receive further grant monies.
22. MEPAU will not be held responsible for the success of the approved purpose for which the grant is applied for or for any losses or additional costs incurred that are associated with the approved purpose.
23. Recipients must comply with all local, State and Commonwealth laws applicable to the approved purpose.
24. Eligible schools are those situated within 200km of the Waitsia Gas Project, situated on Pye Road, Mount Adams, Western Australia. MEPAU has identified these schools as: Dongara DHS, Champion Bay SHS, Geraldton SHS, Holland Street School, Morawa DHS, WA College of Agriculture, Northampton DHS, Carnamah DHS, Jurien Bay DHS and Mullewa DH
